Randi Phillips Earns the Carol Lavell Gifted Fund Scholarship

Randi applied for this scholarship earlier this year and received the \$900 award in November. It is given to only one amateur rider in each Region each year. It was a complex and thorough application process involving many documents and letters of recommendation. Congratulations, Randi!

The objective of the Gifted Fund from the Dressage Foundation is to enable the adult amateur rider and their horse to set aside time to be in an extended training situation that is not readily available during the course of your daily pattern It was named after Carol Lavel and her famous Olympic horse, "Gifted". Recipients must own the horse he/she will train with. It is not intended to include clinics, camps, or symposiums. The model is to encourage a training program of 5-7 consecutive days, with the same trainer, with your teammate horse. They seek out "thinking riders, with strong volunteer back-ground". Volunteer work is to be dressage related, first for your GMO, secondly for your region.

A Minute with the Board October Meeting Summary

Mary Lou Winclechter. <u>Absent</u>: Randi Phillips, , Betty Jorgensen, and Harold Baskin. <u>Guests</u>: DJ Collins, John Collins, Dusty Winclechter, Rusty Cook, Melli and Lisa (Ulla's students visiting from Germany)

Financial Report: Net income remains positive. Rena stated she will be working on the 501c filings. Proposal approved to consider members who joined in Septmber as NMDA and GMO members for 2010.

Schooling Show Update: The September schooling show was cancelled due to weather and Cherry Tree Farm has offered to hold another schooling show November 1.

Year End Awards: Discussed plans for the Awards event, mailing of invitations and finalizing Awards standings.

Publication of Member Listing: Plan to mail out with Awards invitations.

Newsletter Update: Proposal approved to publish the October Flying Changes on the web, notify members via the Yahoo email group that it is available on the web and let members know if they want a paper copied mailed, they can request it and will be put on the list for future mailing. Members who do not have email will automatically receive the paper newsletter by US mail regardless. Discussion and consensus about having the next publication late November or early December to capture the Election and Regionals results **GMO Delegate:** Rusty Cook will be the GMO delegate this year and the Board approved to pay some of her expenses. In return, Rusty will provide a comprehensive written report.

Nominating Committee: Donald has agreed to Chair the Nominating Committee, which also includes John Collins and Jean Podborny. They will develop the balloting process. An email reminder will go out about the Oct 15th deadline for moniations.

Junior Members Fees at Schooling Shows: Susan presented a proposal she received from a member to ask for reduced fees for Junior riders at the NMDA schooling shows due to the fact that some Juniors have difficulty affording the dressage classes at \$20 each. Discussion followed, then the Board members present voted unanimously not to approved this proposal.

Membership Drive: USDF expects the GMOs to submit an initial membership list for 2010 by October 31st. Susan encouraged all Board members to send in their 2010 membership now

General discussion: There was discussion about the need to provide more educational opportunities and to have better communication with the different barn owners about what they are doing so we can keep a current schedule of events happening in our area.

Start planning 2010 Schooling Shows? Susan asked if we should start planning for next year. Board members present expressed that it was too early to do this and we can wait until later in the year.

Open Door Policy: Board Meetings and General Membership Meetings are open to members and others interested in dressage. At Board Meetings only Board members may vote; at General Membership Meetings only current members may vote.

Financial Report: The net income is \$2,136.67. We now have 95 active members. Will plan to review a proposed 2010 budget in the January meeting.

Recognized Show Update: Donald announced he will have a NM State Championship at the Oct 2010 show.

Year End Awards Event: We had 60 members come to the event. The net cost came to about \$600. The overall event was a success with excellent food, but slow service. We'll learn from this to plan next year's event.

Publication of Member Listing: Donald sent out the directory with the ballots.

Newsletter Update: The election results and several articles written by members will be included in the next newsletter. This will be distributed via paper and email per member's requests. Plan to distribute in the next week.

GMO Convention: Rusty Cook is presently attending the national convention in Denver. There will be a discussion at the January meeting concerning a travel budget for the delegate next year. We will do more research in 2010 in order to plan for giving more input at the convention.

Election Results: Thanks to Donald for managing the nominating committee and John and Jean for helping. Susan remains the President and Beth the Vice President. Rena remains the Treasurer. Sue Ann Kirkby is now the secretary. The time frame to mail in the ballots was tight due to the holiday. We may change the bylaws in order to extend the mailing time for next year.

Chair Positions: Ulla will remain the Education Chair and Randi the Awards Chair. Dianne Fay volunteered to be the Newsletter Editor. Amy Mowins volunteered for the Schooling Show Chair and she will store the arena flat bed. Membership and Publicity Chairs are still open, not known if Junior/Youth Chair will be open or not.

2010 Schooling Show Schedule: Considering another shared event with the Arabian Horse club in Feb, since they have the Expo NM site, which is better if weather is bad. John Collins volunteered Cherry Tree for at least two shows. Aiming for nine total, including the Arabian club shows. Plan to continue holding the shows on Sundays. A request was made to have small "r" judges participate in some shows to get more variety.



Auditing the Stephan Kiesewetter Clinic at Windsong Dressage

I count it a privilege to have had the chance to meet Stephan Kiesewetter and audit his clinic. I believe that many people don't realize how much they can benefit from auditing. I had the opportunity to see Stephan work with several horses ranging from training level to Prix St-Georges. We had several breeds represented such as Norwegian Ford, Thoroughbred, Dutch Warmblood and a Trakehner.

Stephan seemed to know just what each rider needed to bring out the best in her horse. He stressed accuracy and consistency so as not to confuse our horses and to have them listening to our aids. Some of the following comments were expressed to the various riders...

"The rider's seat and how the rider uses their seat influences the gates and the outline of the horse more than anything else."

"When I judge dressage, loss of balance in the corners in training level will be forgiven because it is expected. Loss of balance at 1st level may be forgiven once... It will NOT be tolerated at 2nd Level."

"Surround your horse with your aids consistently."

"At the letter' means the letter has to be between the shoulder of the horse and the knee of the rider."

"You can only collect what you have in front."

"Before the downward transition the horse must be open in the poll."

"Give the horse $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of rein at a time to teach the horse how to stretch."

"Ride the horse to your hand... not the hand to the horse."

"The higher you have a horse, the easier it is to pull him into his inside shoulder with the inside hand."

"The first stride into the canter should be uphill, not forward."

"It is better to have the noseband snug or the horse will not respect the rein aids."

"I seldom use draw reins, but this horse has a long bottom line and a short top line which makes it easy to hollow out his back. Adding the draw reins helps this horse to develop the top line."

Stephan had unique challenges addressed to him that showed the incredible amount of insight this man has for developing horse and rider. Each horse and riders progress in the short amount of time with him was evident to all present. His teaching style was non threatening, enabling the rider to overcome nervousness and to incorporate effectively the instructions given.

I am grateful to Ulla Hudson for hosting Stephan Kiesewetter at Windsong Dressage. The indoor facilities, treats and refreshments made for an enjoyable learning experience.
